whose expectations were not met. Either way, if an employee turns against your business, disaster can happen if you are not prepared.

There are ways to stop internal employee attacks. First, make sure to change the passwords, credentials, and authentications immediately when an employee quits or is fired. However, you can't stop there. You must monitor access to current employee credentials closely. Scrutinize confidential account activity and watch for any unusual actions.
