JV Barr Construction A Second Generation Of Building Excellence

Some of life's greatest gifts come wrapped in peculiar packages. Amie Barr, Owner and General Contractor of JV Barr Construction knows this first hand. Amie graduated in 2002 from Coastal Carolina University with a degree in Dramatic Arts and Musical Theater. "My journey to the GC license is actually quite interesting," she said. Amie and a group of friends intended to move to California to pursue their acting dreams until Amie was involved in a bad car accident.

She spent two weeks in a hospital enduring body reconstruction with pins, rods and plates, followed by four months in a hospital bed in her parents' living room. Her father Joseph Virgil Barr, founder of JV Barr Construction Company, would bring home plans in the evening. "He sat by my bed, and we would go over plans. I just found it so intriguing and enlightening; it just fed my soul at the time," Amie recalled. After healing, Amie started accompanying her father on job sites and began to pick up the practicalities of the trade. She decided to go for her GC license. At the time it was a migraine-producing 8-hour

exam that everyone told her not to expect to pass the first time. Amie had the fortitude to stay focused hour after hour. She passed the test (the first time) to become an unlimited general contractor. Amie said. "It was such an amazing success after such a letdown of not being able to go to California and fulfill my dream of becoming a great famous actress!"

Joseph Barr was a full-time minister, and he was also a carpenter, which was his start in the building industry. His ministry in small

on carpentry jobs to add to the family income, and eventually he decided to get his GC license. In hindsight, Amie now realizes that in many ways she and her father didn't realize the company's potential – partly because of the lack of mentorship and support from the building community at the time. "Now I'm in the HGHBA and all these people are willing to help. I see where God has put these people in my life to help me grow this business as big as I want," Amie said. The business began

churches allowed the flexibility to take to gather momentum and then the financial crisis forced Amie to take a job outside of IV Barr, though she kept her hand in, returning frequently to Horry County for various projects.

In 2018 Joseph Barr suffered a fatal heart attack. Amie decided to dedicate herself to JV Barr Construction so that she could redesign and redevelop the company, not only to honor her father's legacy, but to build a future for her own family. Going forward, Amie imagines doing more commercial than residential work. She said, "I just really

Steve Powell, owner of Venture Engineering in Conway, has known the Barr family since the early 2000s. Joseph Barr was the GC on a threebuilding complex, one of which is the office space for Venture Engineering. Steve came to know Joseph Barr through the Conway Church of Christ when Joseph was their minister. "He actually went out and got his GC license so he could be the contractor to finish the church so they would not have to hire a more expensive contractor," Steve said.

IV Barr has been the general contractor on some of Venture Engineering's Dunkin' Donuts projects, additions and upgrades to Sands Ocean Club, and a number of other jobs. Venture Engineering prepares structural plans and works with architects to prepare architectural plans for a building. "A lot of times people will ask if we know a general contractor we can recommend," Steve said, "and IV Barr is often one of the names we would recommend." Steve added, "There's a lot of commercial work going on right now and there's a variety of commercial work.

Sometimes commercial work is simply an up-fit in a strip center where you have a shell space to up-fit to add a business. There are fewer commercial GCs in the area than residential contractors."

Steve has known Amie since she was in high school. He said, "Contractors come in all shapes and sizes. When you have clients that really want to be intimately involved, that's where I generally find that IV Barr excels because of their interpersonal skills. Amie is probably even better than her dad in talking with people, meeting with people, and developing consensus. I think JV Barr's strength is having the ability to work with people that want to be hands-on involved with the construction process."

In Steve's view, "Trust and integrity fundamentally comes down to character and that's something Amie has learned since the day of her birth. Her dad and mom were two of the kindest, most generous people - I couldn't go on enough - and she's got that in every fiber of her body and that's probably why I would say she has a great future in the industry because of those characteristics."
