Two Brothers Wood Works One Of A Kind Hand Crafted Wood Furniture & Home Accents

If you're in the market for unique, American-made, sustainable furniture that is custom made to fit your style, head to Two Brothers Wood Works in Market Common.



Two Brothers Wood Works is a family-owned and operated business that creates heirloom pieces – tables, shelves, bar tops – to order, using wood from trees that have come down through storm damage or sources other than logging or clearing land. The pieces are created at the company's woodworking shop just three miles from the retail location.

Brothers Adam and Mark Landry

lived in Tennessee when they generated the idea for the business. "We had land in Tennessee, and when we'd take trees down, or when other people would take trees down, they'd just pile them up and burn them. You see it a lot around here too. They'll cut down trees or clear land, and they'll pile it up and burn it. One day we had the opportunity to have someone come out that owned a saw mill, and we had a bunch of trees

sliced up, and we said 'Wow, look what's inside of all these beautiful trees.'"

Adam and Mark both had woodworking experience, so they began creating

"A person might see one of our pieces somewhere then come to wood shop and say they want a dining table," said Adam. "We'll show them wood types that would work, see if they like epoxy resin or beach encasements – it depends on what's best for their design. Our work is half interior design and half woodworking. It's not just building the table, but also figuring out what would look best in their space."

"If you buy a table from a chain retail store, you might keep it for 15-20 years," said Adam. "By that point, you can't really refinish it. I like to use the term 'future antique' for our work, because all our pieces are created out of real trees that come from local sources. All the work's done locally. These tables are going to be around for 100 years."



Two Brothers Wood Works is available for commercial work as well; they created the tables at Drift restaurant in Myrtle Beach.
